“WHO PAYS WHEN THE JUDGE IS WRONG?” ATTORNEY ASKS “THIS IS A CIVIL RIGHTS CASE ON BEHALF OF ALL AMERICANS!”

Attorney Clark Garen Brings Class Action Lawsuit Against Nevada Judge That May Lead to Hundreds of Prisoners Having Sentences Overturned!

“Who pays when the Judge is wrong?” asks attorney Clark Garen. “I am trying to establish that it should not be the people who go before the Judge but the Judge himself who should be held accountable.”

In 2004, Mr. Garen brought a \$200,000,000.00 class action lawsuit against Judge Donald M. Mosley of Clark County, Nevada. The lawsuit led to the overturning of Judge Mosley’s incarceration of Mr. Garen’s client, Jeanette Faye Sadoski.

What it has also led to is an historic hearing on the rights of prisoners within the Nevada State Court System. As Mr. Garen uncovered the judge’s “propensity for arbitrary sentencing,” he also realized that there were hundreds of inmates whose sentences were increased by Judge Mosley without “legal right or authority,” exactly as his client’s had been.

Not one to mince words when it comes to the law, Mr. Garen simply states, “There is a problem in America today, and that is government officials who exceed all boundaries of acceptable human behavior, whether it is leaking the name of undercover CIA agents or holding enemy combatants in a state of limbo with no trial and no chance to defend themselves. Judge Mosley is a perfect example of this pattern of one-man rule without the prescription of Law.”

In keeping with that strong statement, Attorney Garen will be arguing that a judge can be held personally liable when he incarcerates a defendant with actual knowledge that he himself had no right or authority to do so.

Further, Mr. Garen is asking that Nevada Director of Prisons Jackie Crawford, Nevada Attorney General Brian Sandoval, and Clark County District Attorney David Roger concede that there is no legal authority to continue to hold the others mentioned in the class action lawsuit. He will seek a judgment that Ms. Sadoski receive damages for wrongful sentencing as a punitive civil action against Judge Mosley and as a deterrent to any other authority figure who would act unilaterally by putting himself above the law.
